The dining room features early nineteenth-century chandeliers and an 1860s bookcase, both Spanish, from the Round Top Antiques Fair. The large trestle table is circa 1890. Custom dining chairs are covered in a Madeaux raw silk and the drapes are Arena Design's hand-blocked velvet.



In the home's kitchen, a pair of eighteenth-century Italian processional lanterns hangs above a sculptor's table from Reggio Emilia, Italy, circa 1900. To make the table functional as a food-prep island, Chapman added drawers and an electrical outlet for appliances. The range is La Cornue, in stainless steel with unlacquered brass trim. Sink and faucets are by Rocky Mountain Hardware. Backsplash tiles are antique concrete.
